West Coast Swing originated from Lindy Hop. Dancers danced a swingier, smoother, and more subdued form of jitterbug to Western swing music. Dean Collins, a Lindy Hop dancer, arrived in Los Angeles around 1937, and was influential in developing this style of swing dance. Laure Haile, an Arthur Murray Dance Studio National Dance Director, documented the unique style of swing dancing in 1951 using the name "Western Swing" to describe it. Arthur Murray Dance Studios developed a syllabus for West Coast Swing beginning from a closed position and the possibility of dancing in a single, double, or triple rhythm.

The term "West Coast Swing" appeared in 1961 and was used in an advertisement by ballroom dancer Skippy Blair circa 1958–1962. However, the term wasn't incorporated into mainstream swing circles until the late 1960s. Blair preferred the name because of the ambiguous meaning of "Western," usually referring to country and western, as distinguished from "West Coast," referring to California. Blair credits Jim Bannister, the Herald American newspaper editor in Downey, California, for suggesting the name.

While teenagers preferred to dance freestyle during the 1960s, adults kept swing alive. The advent of disco music in the 1970s revitalized partner dancing. By 1978, "California Swing" had developed as a variation, with styling that Blair wrote was "considered more UP, with a more Contemporary flavor."

In 1988, West Coast Swing was pronounced the Official State Dance of California. Excerpted from Wikipedia:

Why is there a Leap Year? Annie's Corner

For three years, if you were to count all the days in a calendar from January to December, you'd count 365 days. But every fourth year, February has 29 days instead of 28. So, there are 366 days in that fourth year. This is called a leap year. But, do we really need one? To explain: First, we have to know what a solar year is. It takes approximately 365.25 days for the Earth to orbit our Sun; that's called a solar year. But, to make up for that partial day (.25), we add one day to our calendar year every four years. We've actually added six hours every year and we can't continue doing that.

That's why we have a leap year. We have to fit that day in every four years. If we didn't, we'd eventually be celebrating the 4th of July in the winter. (continued next column)

A year: the amount of time it takes a planet to orbit the son one time.

A day (24 hours): the amount of time it takes a planet to finish one rotation on its axis.
